


In 1795 the Polish lands were partitioned among the Kingdom of Prussia, the Russian Empire, and Old Austria.



World War I 1914-1918 Poland regained its independence as the Second Polish Republic in 1918






In 1939 Nazi Germany and Soviet Union invaded Poland thus starting the II World War. Over six million Polish citizens died in the war.



In 1952 The People's Republic was declared although Poland was a client state of the Soviet Union from the closing days of the war.



During the Revolutions of 1989 with the great role of Solidarność, the communist state was overthrown and democratic rule was re-established in the form of the current Poland, constitutionally known as the "Third Polish Republic".







Poland joined the NATO in 1999 and became a member of the European Union on 1 May 2004

Poland is also a member of the World Trade Organization, the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), European Economic Area, International Energy Agency, Council of Europe, Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe, International Atomic Energy Agency, European Space Agency, G6, Council of the Baltic Sea States, Visegrád Group, Weimar Triangle and Schengen Agreement.




The beauty of Poland

Tatra Mountains are the highest and the most majestic...










Mazury region is famous for its lakes
